2022 LARIMER COUNTY FAIR COWBOY BOOTS & COUNTRY ROOTS

The 19th Fair hosted at the Ranch Events Complex was a triumphant celebration of bringing our local and 4-H community together. The Theme was Cowboy Boots and Country Roots. The Fair was launched with our fantastic community parade in downtown Loveland the weekend before. We saw many local organizations and businesses, the 4-H community, and our commissioners actively participate in the parade. This year's Fair was unique, with not one Queen in attendance but three, our Larimer County Fair Queen, Morgan Crouse, was joined by Miss Rodeo America, Hailey Frederiksen, and Miss Rodeo Colorado, Ashley Baller.

We had many fun events at the Fair; the Queens BBQ was a very popular evening. The Pancake breakfast was a huge hit, with hundreds of people in attendance. The 4-H Youth and Community Arena Building had its groundbreaking and drew a large crowd in attendance. We were honored to have the Loveland Mayor Jacki Marsh, our Larimer County Commissioners, Kristin Stephens, Jody Shadduck-McNally, John Kefalas. The County Manager Lorenda Volker, and members of the Fair Board. In addition to 4-H, Kerri Rollins, County director, and Kathay Rennels attended along with 4-H families instrumental in the planning.

FAIR VENDORS

We saw a significant increase in overall Fair vendors for 2022. We had 55 vendors, a significant jump from 2021 we had 35 vendors.

TRAFFIC VEHICLE COUNTERS | CELL PHONE CAPTURE

Traffic counters had one go down on Saturday that was counting the Main Gate vehicles – we calculated an average and estimated 87,000



2022 ATTENDANCE CONT.

The 2nd way we monitored attendance is with the help of the City of Loveland using geofencing. That captures cell phones in an area at a set date and time. We did this for 2022 fair and recorded 130,000 phones that visited and re-visited the Fair. And 94,000 unique visitors. This also allows us to see where the cell phone's zip code is from.


This is held in the Budweiser center on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday nights of the fair.
